

Omar Kurdi is the CEO of Friends for Life Rehabilitation Services, an agency providing services to adults with developmental disabilities. He is of Jordanian American descent and is from Cleveland, Ohio. Kurdi holds a Master's degree in Public Administration from Indiana Wesleyan University and a Bachelor's degree in International Relations from Cleveland State University. Outside of work, he is a theatre and writing enthusiast, and Kurdi founded Masrah Cleveland Al-Arabi, a theatre company within the Cleveland Public Theatre that aims to connect Arabic-speaking communities in Cleveland. He currently serves as a member of Cleveland Public Theatre's Board of Directors, and also was appointed to the Community Advisory Board of Ideastream, the NPR and PBS affiliate in Northeast Ohio. In August 2020, Crain's Cleveland Business Magazine named Kurdi as a Notable Immigrant Leader, and in October of 2020, the Arab America Foundation selected him as one of their "40 Under 40 Arab Americans" recipients.
